“Inherent risks of equine activities” shall mean those dangers or conditions which are an integral part of equine activities, including, but not limited to:

- (i) the propensity of any equine to behave in ways that may result in injury, harm or death to persons on or around them and/or damage to property in their vicinity;
- (ii) the unpredictability of an equine’s reaction to such things as sounds, sudden movements and unfamiliar objects, persons or other animals;
- (iii) the equine’s response to certain hazards such as surface and subsurface objects;
- (iv) collisions with other equines, animals, people and objects;
- (v) the potential of a participant to act in a negligent manner that may contribute to injury to the participant or other, such as failing to maintain control over the equine or to act within his or her ability.

Neither SUNWEST EQUINE SERVICES or the YOUTH EMERGENCY SHELTER SOCIETY or it’s owners, the organizing committee of the show, officials, volunteers, staff, or agents shall in any way be liable for any accident, injury, damage, loss or for any other matter that may happen to exhibitors, competitors, owners, agents or to anyone on the grounds or to any animal or article brought to the grounds. It is to be understood and agreed that by making any entry in the Y.E.S.S. **DIRECTIONS - From Hwy 33**, go east at the Rich Valley School onto Twp. Rd. 564 for 5 miles to Range Road 23. Go south for 1.5 miles to **56217 R.R. 23** (east side of R.R. 23)

**From Hwy 16**, go north on Hwy 43 past Onoway turnoff to Hwy 37. Go east on Hwy 37 two miles to Hwy 777. Go north on Hwy 777 for 8 miles (last two miles are dirt) to Twp. Rd. 562. Go west on Twp. Rd. 562 two miles to R.R. 23. Go north on R.R. 23 for ½ mile. Second driveway on the east side at **56217 R.R. 23**

## DESCRIPTION OF EVENTS

**FILL A HORSE TRAILER** - Every competitor and spectator is asked to donate an item from the list for the Youth Emergency Shelter. Tax receipts will be given for cash donations of \$10.00 or more. If items have been purchased, you can submit the receipts for an official tax receipt. Please write your name and address on the back of the receipt.

**ENTRY FEES** - Entry fee is \$10.00 per class. Any person who has collected \$100.00 or more in pledges may enter any number of classes at **no charge**. (One rider or handler with one or more horses, or one horse with one or more riders or handlers.)

**TACK** – Any legal bit on any aged horse. Two hands are permitted with leverage bits, martingales and other training equipment also permitted

**DRESS** – Show clothes are not required. Helmets are required for those under 18 and encouraged for those over 18. Footwear must have a minimum 5/8" heel.

**AGE OF RIDER** as of January 1, 2011

**HALTER CLASSES** – Any aged handler. Competitors may show more than one horse in a class provided they have people to hold the other horses.

**IN HAND TRAIL** – will be held in a separate area. Entrants are to do their course in between classes as time permits. Horse must be lead with a halter and shank. Chains are permitted.

**SHOWMANSHIP CLASSES** – Patterns will be posted.

**PLEASURE CLASSES** – English or Western, each entry will be judged according to riding style and breed standard.

**REINING WALK TROT** – Modified pattern will be posted. Entrants may have someone coaching them from inside or outside the ring. The Walk Trot Reining will be held in a separate area with a different judge. Entrants are to do their pattern in between classes as time permits.

**TOILER PAPER PAIRS** – Pairs will be required to follow the judge's instructions while holding on to the ends of a length of toilet paper. You will be eliminated if your toilet paper breaks. If you do not have a partner but would like to enter this class, please indicate on the entry form by writing the class number and circling it, and we will attempt to find a partner for you.

**WATER RACE** – Teams of 4 will be required to fill a container with water using a cup. The winning team will have the most water in the container. Help will be given to those who have trouble connecting with the water bucket. Teams will be selected at the beginning of the class.

**MUSICAL STALLS** – Similar to musical chairs, stalls will consist of poles laid on the ground.

**OPPOSITE PAIRS** – What ever makes you opposite from your partner. English – Western, large horse – small horse, male – female, anything goes. Costumes are encouraged.

**EQUITATION** – English or Western, will be judged according to the style of riding and the breed standard.

**ON COMMAND** – All ages. Instruction will be given before the class starts.

**REINING** – All ages, pattern will be posted. Simple lead changes permitted.
